


From the President's Garage



The year was 1999.






Fraud!

Well, not too long ago, a criminal downloaded photos of this blue & white Safari from an online auction website. then used them to create a fraudulent eBay auction. Fortunately, the scam was caught just in time before anybody lost money.





During the month of February, two previously sold 1957

Safari wagons were placed on eBay for auction. The problem was that neither wagons were being offered by

their lawful owners. The auctions were scams!

- Vehicle that was sold in a previous auction.






We are not immune to fraud.

Glass is good except on curved rear glass is cracked. Still in place and intact Under hood is set up for original 347, as new front mount is designed into the Camaro crossmember.
